

Starting with April 2020, being an employee of the public health directorate of Bucharest, he served as coordinating physician of the Covid-19 communication and reporting center, carrying out an intense activity aimed at combating the pandemic, by conducting epidemiological investigations of patients confirmed positive with the virus and applying restriction measures, in order to limit the spread of the Sars-Cov-2 virus.

Currently, he monitors and coordinates the activity of the emergency response structures within the health units in the public sector, the mobile services, reanimation and extraction from a medical point of view




